## Let's play dominos with the /s/ sound

Why practice sounds in a traditional way when you can play and practice them at the same time?

Playing dominos is an easy way to make you articulation therapy fun and enjoyable for your students.

Amount of players: 2-4
Duration: up to 20 minutes
Prep:

1. Print in color or black and white.
2. Laminate for more duration
3. Cut each tile
4. Play!

How to play:

1. Scramble all the tiles.
2. Each student grabs 7 tiles.
3. The student to your left starts throwing any tile. Such student will have to read each word in the tiles (words will target the /s/ sound).
4. The next student will have to match his/her tile with the one already on the table. Once matched, he/she will have to name the word matched.
5. The first student to give out all tiles wins!

Note: If you have a group of less than 4 students, the extra tiles can be placed on the side. When a student does not have a matching tile, he/she can have the opportunity to grab from the extra tiles.
