




#### **Carrot Facts**

- Carrots have two parts: the plant and the root. People usually eat the root.
   Although not as common, you can also eat the leafy plant portion.
- The plant is green and sticks out of the ground. The root grows underground.
- Carrots can be eaten in different ways.
  They can be eaten raw or cooked. They can be dipped in dressing, boiled in soups, or mashed in a casserole. They can even be juiced!
- The root portion of carrots are usually orange, but they can also be other colors! They can be purple, white, or yellow.
- Beta-carotene is the pigment that makes carrots orange. If you eat too many carrots, your skin can even start turning orange! Don't worry, this is a harmless condition and your skin will go back to its usual color when you stop eating so many carrots.
- The human body converts betacarotene into vitamin A. Vitamin A helps you have healthy eyes, bones, and skin.

#### Rabbit Facts


- Rabbits are small mammals that live in groups.

  Rabbits can live in the wild or be kept as a pet.


