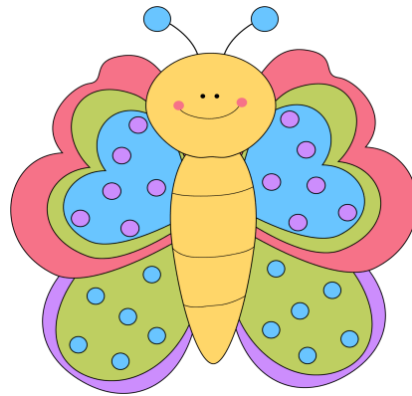
Spring Time Idioms Activity

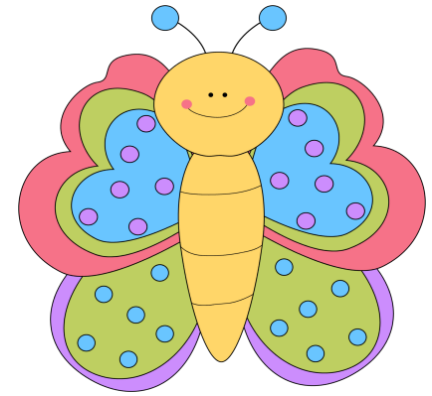
There is a worksheet for your students to create an idiom journal of all the new idioms they learn. They can take the journal home as review or have them write a story trying to use some of the idioms from their journal.
